



RECONNECTION SEASON

- Updated SJBC Covid-19 protocols which can be found on the website.
- Expanded in-person hybrid Sunday worship services to include 8am and increased the number of attendees to 150 worshippers at both services (8 am and 10:15 am).
- **Used various platforms** to keep our congregation informed about what is going on.
- Classrooms were equipped with necessary technology to offer hybrid classes, meetings, activities and services.
- Honored Deacon Harold Williams for over 4 decades of service in the SJBC deacon ministry. He has transitioned to deacon emeritus.
- **Planned a fun family** drive-in movie night. 80 people came and watched "The Wiz".



RECONNECTION SEASON

Virtual Bible Study — Engaged 60-110 students each Monday for lessons from scripture to inspire spiritual growth.

Virtual Sunday School Classes — Engaged an average of 100 students from children to adults each Sunday in 6 different classes

Virtual Power Half-Hour is hosted weekly with pastoral staff and associate ministers on Facebook and YouTube each Wednesday



SJBC Initiatives-God First 90 Day Tithing challenge

- Challenge Goals:
 - Increase the number of tithers
 - Increase the number of giving units in 2022
 - Increase our annual revenue to exceed our initial projection

SJBC Initiatives-God First 90 Day Tithing challenge continued



- 3 levels of giving
 - Grace Giver- this giver is accepting the challenge to give above and beyond the tithes and offerings.
 - Tither- this giver is committing to continue giving God 10% of their earnings.
 - Faith \$50- this person may be saying I don't see how I can give but they want to begin the giving journey by giving \$50.00 a week

GIVING & REVENUE

- Try the Tithe Sunday (1st Sun. in June and July) is used to teach the principals and benefits of tithing
- Every 2nd Sunday a different leader/ member gave a Tithing Testimony during our Sunday services.
- Mid-Year giving statement mailings and Pastoral giving letter
- Hosting Virtual Financial Workshops with Financial Peace University.
 Members can access videos at their own pace and gain financial principles.
- **Provided \$26,900 in scholarships** to 59 high school graduates and recurring college students to provide financial support.
- SJBC congregation faithfully gave to the Youth Enhancement Fund (YEF).



SPECIAL WORSHIP AT SJBC

- Execute 1 virtual (12 noon) and 2 high-quality hybrid Sunday services (8 a.m. and 10:15 a.m.) and 1 virtual midweek Power Half Hour service intended to reach intergenerational demographics.
- Hosted a hybrid 7 Last Words Experience on Good Friday at 7pm. Rev. Rickey preached and guest artists Omar Williams and Zacardi Cortez ministered through song. 100 inperson attendees, 1100 viewers watched between the 2 services, and \$3,873 was collected exceeding our goal. Last year we collected \$2,631.
- Men's conference and Day 2022, 45 men attended the conference. Our guest preacher Rev. Dr. Fredrick Johnson from Rochester, NY, preached both hybrid services. 1350 viewers online and 100 in-person attendees. We raised \$7,853. Our goal still remains \$15K. Last year we collected \$9,040 which exceeded the goal of \$8,000.
- Hosted hybrid Senior Recognition Sunday, celebrating Seniors of SJBC. Rev. Sadie Woolford and Sis. Joann Sellers were honored with special awards.
- Hosted hybrid mid-week Wednesday night Power Hour Anniversary service. We honored the late Rev. Ella Moore for her years of dedicated service. 40 attended in person and 40 attended online.

PASTORAL & CONGREGATIONAL CARE

- Provided bereavement care support to Senior Pastor (Revs. West & Harvey) by serving families of SJBC & community at funerals through eulogies and officiating both virtually and in-person. 11 SJBC families were served, and several non-SJBC members.
- Grief Share Ministry continued to serve virtually (13 week support group) supporting grieving members of SJBC and some outside of Maryland who were able to attend despite not living in the area because it was offered virtually.
- Hosted mid day and evening Ash Wednesday drive through. Over 100 members and community members received ashes.



GENDER-BASED MINISTRIES

Men's Ministry

- Hosted a SJBC Brotherhood BBQ and Spades Tournament in May. 45 brothers attended.
- Recognized Col. Ira Snell Jr. as the 2022 SJBC Man of the Year.

Women's Ministry

 Women's Mother's Day Tea was hosted virtually, and was attended by 32 women.

Senior's Ministry

 Golden Hearts monthly engaged seniors for fellowship and enrichment.










Connecting through Community

FREE HEALTH SERVICES AND SCREENINGS

- SJBC is the only faith based full service vaccination clinic in the State of Maryland. We partner with First Call Urgent Care to provide free COVID-19 testing and vaccinations for all ages.
- Through our partnership we have seen over 30,000 people that have received either a free COVID-19 test and/or COVID-19 vaccination.
- Offered community health screenings, through Howard County General Hospital's Journey to Better Health (J2BH) program, 30 people received screenings.
- Held 2 Red Cross Blood drives, at SJBC in support of patients with sickle cell disease with 80 donors. We have 2 more drives scheduled for this year.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Distributed more than 45,000 pounds of food to >260 families each month. We have 3 distribution sites.
- Co-facilitated an Offsite Cold Weather Shelter for 26 people during one week in February
- 5th Sunday Missions and Community Outreach Initiatives:
 - January raised 5K for HCGH stress reduction equipment, gave 130 thank you cards and thank you videos from youth department
 - May donated Summer Enrichment supplies to CAC Head Start. Provided \$2,095 to HCGH for stress reduction equipment, the congregation provided 100 Thank You cards to frontline workers, Staff recorded thank you videos.
 - July- assisting HCC with non-perishable food items for their student food pantry





COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Distributed 150 new Easter outfits for girls and boys in need.
- Distributed 125 Easter baskets to the community and 25 prepared meals to seniors in our congregation.
- Received 50K grant through the Health Department.
 We have assisted 255 residents with benevolence needs.
- Hosted a New Mother's Support group in partnership with HCGH J2BH. 20 new mother's and their babies attended.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Provided HCGH with a sponsorship amount of \$3K to support and recognize their Heroes In Healthcare during the pandemic. Staff attended the event.
- Hosted virtual Courageous Conversations with 60 different congregations. 350 people participated. This is a major increase from our initial 6 congregations when we started several years ago.
- Jack and Jill used SJBC space to host a drive-in movie night on our parking lot. 68 cars came to the event.
- AACR used SJBC space to host a Diabetes Awareness event on our parking lot. 40 people attended the event.

To create a gathering space that will serve members and the community through:


- Empowerment Create empowerment and networking opportunities for people of all ages.
- Education Create holistic intergenerational academic, spiritual and ministry related enrichment and lifelong learning opportunities.
- Recreation Utilize the gymnasium space and walking track for recreational activities such as basketball, volleyball, fitness training, fitness classes.
- Fellowship Utilize classes and event space for childcare, meetings and a stage for theater productions, speaking, etc.

CHURCH/COMMUNITY NEEDS

OVERHEAD VIEW OF SJBC AND YFLC




YFLC FRONT ELEVATION










FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- How much will it cost?
 - \$9.5M
 - Detailed plans will allow accurate pricing and competitive bids.
- What is included in the \$9.5M?
 - A Youth and Family Life Center that increases our capacity to serve our congregation and community from children to seniors to families.
- Why build a YFLC as soon as we are financially ready?
 - Studies have shown that isolation during the pandemic has negatively impacted mental health. Opportunities to gather as a faith community and general community are needed to increase social interaction. Space has been designed for people to gather outside the facility, as well as inside.
 - Current Howard County elected officials and state legislators are interested in discussing what level of financial support would be feasible.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- How will we pay for it?
 - We will present a multi-pronged fundraising plan to the Finance & Operations Ministry, Board of Trustees, and congregation that leverages internal and external funding opportunities.
 - A capital campaign will give members the privilege and opportunity to be a part of having a Kingdom impact in Columbia, throughout Maryland, and around the world.
- When will we build the YFLC?
 - The church leadership and congregation will determine when we will be ready to build, which may or may not be this year or next. It will be when we are in a strong enough financial position to do so.






